Dear Parents and Caregivers

The weeks are flying past and there is so much happening at school. There is lots of fun being had at the moment with Year 6 fun day. Congratulations to the students and teachers for their organisation.

Yesterday's excursion to Calmsley Hill Farm looked terrific. Last week, Stage 1 had fun being scientists. The week finished up with the P&C Disco. This week, the students in the Support Unit have been at the Variety Christmas function and transition to high school. There are lots of photos about all of these events on Instagram to keep you up to date!

Thank you to the teachers who worked the late shift last Friday night at the Disco. Thank you also to the parents who helped out selling glow in the dark novelties, to the P&C exec for organising the night and the canteen for staying open to sell treats! There is information about how funds raised will be spent in the P&C report.

P&C Uniform Shop

Yesterday a note went home with all students explaining the future of the Uniform Shop. There is also a copy in FOCUS if you missed yesterday's note. Please read the information so you are fully informed about where and how you can buy Peakhurst PS uniforms.

Handover Sheets and Reports

The finishing touches are being put on the reports to be sent home. They are going through their first and second reads. The reports will be ready to go home in week 9. However, if you wish to speak with your child's class teacher, you are welcome to make an appointment. At the same time as writing reports, teachers are completing a 'handover sheet' to give to next year's teacher. This supports the conversations that teachers have to ensure that the transition from one class to the next is as smooth as possible.

Classes 2020

Our numbers are changing from week to week. At the present time we have 23 classes for 2020. (This year there are 24 in mainstream. Support Unit classes are stable and filled under a different system.) However, an additional few enrolments will change that. It is likely that students will remain in their 2019 class groupings for the first few days of 2020. I don't want to put students into classes and then have to re-arrange them because we have an additional class with new enrolments. I know this is not something that traditionally happens at Peakhurst but as we are no longer able to back fill numbers with out of area enrolments, it has become more of a waiting game.

If you are going away and your child will not be returning for the start of the school year in 2020 can you please write a note to the class teacher so that your child can be included in numbers and therefore class arrangements.

Speaking with Children who are not your Own

Please **DO NOT** speak with children who are not your own if you feel your child has been slighted. Please speak with the class teacher or an executive and let the school manage any issues. I know we all want to protect our cubs but you are simply not allowed to take those matters into your own hands. We do act on situations when we become aware of problems. The Enclosed Land act can be evoked which prevents people from entering the school grounds and keeps all students safe.

Parking and Driving

I have applied for a crossing supervisor for the Bailey Parade crossing. Research is conducted before a supervisor is appointed. There is a tally of the number of cars taken driving up and down Bailey Parade during school time. A tally of pedestrian traffic is also taken. The company running this research is hoping to conduct the program before the end of the school year. I will keep you posted.

Greenlands Ave continues to be a nightmare. Please do not park in neighbours driveways...even if you are running late, and please be careful of students crossing between cars. If you are one of the families who enjoy a chat, food, drinks etc of an afternoon with your friends, please take your rubbish with you.

If you are driving around the school, please be mindful of driving within the 40kmh range...even when you are running late.

STAGE 1 INCURSION – SLIME, SHERBET & BUBBLES

On Thursday 21st of November, 2 Green went to the science incursion. We did some fun experiments. The first one was to make slime. Could you be an ethics teacher for Peakhurst Public School?

Ethics teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the ethics program. Training consists of a two day workshop and short online modules. Lesson materials are provided. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available at 9.20am on Tuesday morning each week.


In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

- how do we treat living things?
- what is laziness?
- how do we disagree in a respectful way?
- fairness



P&C FUNDRAISING FOR 2019

As the end of the year draws near, we would like to thank the school community for supporting the P&C's fundraising efforts throughout 2019. Through events such as the Easter Raffle, the Election Day BBQs and cake stall, the Mothers and Father's Day stalls, the Trivia Night and most recently the Disco, the P&C have managed to raise approximately \$15,000 this year.

We are happy to say that these funds, along with funds from previous years, will now be transferred to the school to be used towards the following playground upgrades, some of which will take place over the summer holidays.

- Softfall is to be laid on the playground between Block A and the Library (which will include handball courts, and other games). The cost of this project is in excess of \$75,000 and the P&C is contributing \$20,000.
- A Yarning Circle (an outdoor learning space) will be constructed in the quiet area of the junior playground. The cost of this project is approximately \$35,000 and the P&C is contributing \$15,000.

PEAKHURST PUBLIC SCHOOL UNIFORM SHOP

Dear Parents and Caregivers

As documented in both FOCUS and the P&C Minutes over recent weeks, the P&C have been considering the future operation of the Peakhurst PS Uniform Shop. This review has become necessary for the reasons outlined below.

Reasons for Review

- Our current Uniform Shop Coordinator has resigned from the position effective as soon as possible.
- The shop relies heavily on the commitment of volunteers from our school community and we understand that the availability of volunteers has been very limited for many years.
- As the shop is now a significant small business operating in an ever-changing environment, the role of Coordinator has become more specialised and requires a broad range of skills and knowledge (including retail operations, financial management and reporting, stock control and ordering, management of the online ordering facility, management and training of volunteer staff, as well as the necessary compliance obligations such as ATO reporting, superannuation, and insurances).
- As the business is seasonal in nature, the time commitment required of the Coordinator varies significantly between weeks and between terms. Therefore, the Coordinator needs to be extremely flexible in availability.
- It has always been the goal of the Uniform Shop to provide quality uniforms to families of Peakhurst PS at an affordable price. This remains the focus throughout this process.

A Brief History

Historically, the Uniform Shop was managed by the P&C and operated by volunteers, as a service to the school community. As the school grew, the workload for the volunteer Coordinator and staff increased dramatically and it became challenging to juggle this with volunteers' personal and work commitments. The Uniform Shop developed into a significant small business with the obligations and challenges that accompany that. In light of this, in 2014, the Coordinator position became a paid one. Since then, the Uniform Shop Coordinator has been employed by the P&C and has been paid according to the retail employee's award. The position was last advertised and filled in 2018.

Over many years, the school has benefited from the modest profits returned through the Uniform Shop. When available, these funds have been invested in various school improvement projects, benefiting all the children and families of Peakhurst PS. However, as the school has grown, and costs and overheads have gradually increased, the net funds earned by the Uniform Shop have diminished accordingly.

The Future

Given the above circumstances, the P&C have now had the opportunity to consider the options available to it in relation to the future of the Uniform Shop.

Following extensive research and lengthy discussion, the P & C has voted unanimously to outsource the supply of Peakhurst PS uniforms to Claudine Schoolwear at Caringbah. Claudine Schoolwear specialise in the supply of school uniforms to many schools and have a strong reputation in the area.

We understand that this is a significant change for our school, and as such, may raise some concerns. We do appreciate this. Please be assured that this is not a decision that has been reached without extensive thought and consideration of the best alternative for us as a school community.

We believe that this direction is appropriate and beneficial for our school at this time for the following reasons:

• FEASABILITY: The obligations associated with running a small business and employing staff today are onerous. It was agreed that this operation was no longer viable for the P&C.

- EXPERIENCE: Claudine Schoolwear is a specialist supplier of school uniforms. They currently supply a number of our uniform items and we have a good relationship with them.
- CONTINUITY: All uniform items will remain consistent with no changes to current styles.
- COMPETITIVE: As Claudine Schoolwear services over 100 schools in the St George and Sutherland shires, their capacity to buy stock at competitive prices is increased, which will assist in maintaining the affordability of our uniforms, with prices to remain at current levels.
- OPENING HOURS / ACCESSIBILITY: Claudine Schoolwear has a shop located in President Avenue, Caringbah. Parking is available nearby and the shop is situated close to Caringbah railway station. The shop is open 5 ½ days per week including Saturday mornings. The shop is also open during school holidays.
- ONLINE ORDERING: Uniform orders can be placed online, with delivery to your home/work address for a flat delivery fee of \$5.50 per order.
- POP UP STORE: At various peak times through the year (such as the beginning of Term 1 and Kindergarten Orientation), Claudine Schoolwear will visit our school and set up a "Pop-up Shop" to enable families to purchase uniforms at the school. These days will be advertised ahead of time through FOCUS and via the eNews App.
- FUND RAISING: Claudine Schoolwear offer a rebate system to the schools they supply, whereby a small percentage of sales of Peakhurst PS uniforms will be paid to the school. These funds will be directed towards school improvement projects, such as playgrounds, resources and other school facilities.

So What's Next?

The final day of trade for the Peakhurst PS Uniform Shop will be advised as soon as an agreement has been formalised. Please note that the school community will be notified immediately this is established and the shop will continue to open as normal until that time.

Following this date, the remaining stock will be transferred to Claudine Schoolwear on consignment, in preparation for them to commence selling the Peakhurst PS uniform to the families of our school community. Please note that we will endeavour to make the transition as seamless as possible and be assured that there will be no interruption to uniform availability, prior to the commencement of Term 1. (As this consignment stock is sold, Peakhurst PS will be reimbursed for the costs of the uniforms on a quarterly basis).

Second Hand Shop

It is planned that a second hand clothing pool will continue to operate within the school. As it will be run by volunteers, the operation and opening hours of the clothing pool will rely on the availability of volunteers from the school community and will be advised as soon as it is known. We gratefully welcome any volunteers who may feel able to assist in this way.

Thank You

The P&C would like to take this opportunity to thank those who have given of their time to assist in the Uniform Shop over the years it has operated. Their contribution to the school is greatly valued and appreciated. We would also like to thank the current Coordinator for her commitment to the shop since taking on the role, and for her flexibility surrounding timing of her resignation.

We look forward to this new opportunity and appreciate your support as we move forward.
