PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Caregivers

As you know, over the next 3 weeks we are having 'Meet the Teacher 'evenings where information will be shared about your child's learning program, Stage and class expectations and routines. It is an opportunity to meet your child's teacher if you haven't already done so.

If you have any questions that relates directly to your child it would be great if you could make an appointment where the question can be dealt with in a confidential manner with the teacher at another time.

We ask that only parents attend the information evenings and alternative arrangements are made for children.

PEG Information evening

The PEG 'Meet the Teacher' evening will be held on Wednesday, 6th March from 5:30-6:30pm in the Gumbayah Centre.

Please note that the Year 6 High School Information session for all year 6 students, will be held on Wednesday, 27th February from 6:30-7.00pm in the Blue/Aqua classroom following the Stage 3 'Meet the Teacher' session.

Maths Groups

Maths groups started this week and will run on Mon, Tues and Wed. They will focus on the Number Strand and Patterns and Algebra. The other strands will be covered in a differentiated manner in the child's class. The teachers took this decision so that they had more direct experience with students in their own class in mathematics.

Afternoon Pick-up

Can I please ask that families discuss with their children pick-up arrangements and protocols for leaving school safely. There have been some stressed grandparents and parents over the last couple of weeks who have arrived at school to pick up their charges, only to find the child has gone home with someone else or walked home or met up with friends etc.

A good idea is to have a secret password for the family that must be used by anyone who picks up the child in the event of an emergency. Only the child and their family know the given word.

If any arrangements change suddenly or you are held up please notify the school before the end of the day school bell so we can let the child know.

Staff Development Day Changes

This year, Peakhurst Public School staff are working with Penshurst West PS, Peakhurst South PS, Lugarno PS and GRC Peakhurst Campus to explore Growth Mindset with Dan Haeslar. We will attend 4 twilight sessions of PL in Terms 1, 2 and 4 in lieu of the end of year Staff Development Day on 19th and 20th December. Students finish school on 18th December this year.

'Dan Haeslar is an international keynote speaker, educator, writer and consultant. He works with organisations around issues of engagement, mindset and wellbeing.'

I have also booked Dan for a parent information evening on Tuesday, 22nd October from 6:30-7:30 if you would like to put it in your diary.

Apology to the Stolen Generation

On Wednesday, 13th February 2008, the Australian Parliament led by Prime Minister Rudd apologised to the Stolen Generation and the many families impacted by the actions of governments over time in forcibly removing children. This followed on from the recommendations made in the Bringing Them Home report tabled in 1997. Following the Apology, Lorraine Peeters, a member of the Stolen Generation, presented the Prime Minister and the Leader of the Opposition with a glass coolamon, made by Bai Bai Napangardi, a Balgo artist. Inside the coolamon was a message thanking the Parliament for saying 'sorry' – that the Apology showed compassion and opened a path for walking together in the future.

READING EGGS/ READING EGGSPRESS

We are able to provide a 12 month subscription to your child through the school subscription at a heavily discounted price (RRP is \$79). Reading Eggs and Reading Eggspress provide students with completely individualised, one-on-one lessons which allow them to progress at their own rate in reading and comprehension. Reading Eggs (Kindergarten – Year 4) focuses on phonics and sight words, using skills and strategies essential for sustained reading success.

Reading Eggspress (Year 1-6) is designed to build children's skills in reading, comprehension, spelling, vocabulary, and grammar. Reading Eggspress Library consists of over 2500 online books for kids. These books cover a wide range of genres to suit children of all ages and reading levels and can be accessed by all students.

MATHLETICS

Mathletics is an interactive and engaging online program that offers a range of activities aligned to the Australian primary maths curriculum. Students will have access to a full set of activities supported by interactive tutorials as well as print-based materials. Mathletics offers a range of engaging games and activities for students to explore mathematical concepts in playful and supportive learning environments.

SOUND WAVES

This year the school will be using the Sound Waves Spelling program for Kindergarten to Year Six. It is a synthetic phonics approach which focuses on the process of synthesising (i.e. taking small parts and putting them together to form a whole). It uses a soundto-letter strategy which acknowledges that sounds can be represented more than one way in written form.

Sound Waves supports the whole school Spelling Scope and Sequence by ensuring that all students are explicitly and sequentially taught the curriculum expectations.

Students will be able to access the Sound Waves Online program both at school and home. There is a large number of materials and activities on the Sound Waves website that will reinforce and consolidate the children's learning.



Next week Years 1-6 will begin using the Sound Waves spelling program. Your child's teacher will give them access to Sound Waves Online via their specific grade login. They will be able to access it at home at

We will be reviewing the students understanding of what phonemes and graphemes are.

Phoneme: A phoneme is the basic unit of sound in a word.

Grapheme: Graphemes are the letter or letter combinations used to represent the phonemes in written form.

Transition has gone really well. Kimberley is doing a great job keeping on top of the orders Kimberley and Sue to meet up a couple more times to g through finals bits and pieces of paperwork and banking. 			

<u>Disco</u>

- The disco was a great success. Thank you to Margaret M and Sue H for their organisation. Thank you to Moussa for the watermelon cups and to the volunteers who came along to help on the night.
- 370 tickets were presold at \$8 and, 8 tickets were sold at the door at \$10. A total of 378 children attended the disco this year.
- There were over 100 tickets purchased online through Flexischools. This is great as it means less cash to count for the P&C volunteers.
- The P&C raised \$3,112.00 through ticket sales. The P&C are just awaiting the invoice from Moussa C to advise the profit raised on the night.
- Glow sticks were sold on the night. The total cost of the glow sticks was \$543.40. After sales the P&C raised a profit of \$297.60. There are still glow sticks available. There is a 12month shelf life use on the glow sticks therefore the glow sticks could be kept for next year's disco or for sale at the year 6 fun day. It is important to make sure they are used as soon as possible.
- It was a fun night for all. The DJ was great!
- It was successful having the Canteen open on the night.

<u>Walkathon</u>

- Thanks to Coralie B for making the announcement to continue to ask for funds to be handed in.
- The P&C raised \$11,578.00. This surpassed our goal of \$10,000. The money raised will be used to upgrade our school's playgrounds, home readers (need \$40,000), year 6 farewell and various other school improvement projects. We only aim for \$10-\$15 to be raised per child.
- There were prizes presented at the morning assembly for students who had collected the most money and for participating.
- Suggestion from Kristy D next year perhaps students just pay a participation fee if they don't want to collect money.

Year 6 Farewell

- \$10 was requested from each student and \$10 from the teachers also. The P&C will subsidize, drinks, food and decorations. Margaret M to check with Jenny with regard to when payment is to be made (cheque to be given on the night or before).
- The Year 6 Farewell has been booked for the 10th December at the Old's Park Sports Club,

School zone safety

Council is committed to promoting safe parking practices around schools, particularly durinschool zone times, on school days between 8.00am-9.30am and 2.30pm-4.00pm

To help deter drivers from choosing to park illegally, Council officers regularly patrol school zones and may issue penalty notices. Officers are also a valuable source of information on how to park safely and avoid receiving a penalty notice.


You can help to promote safety and reduce congestion around schools

- Avoid waiting in 'No Parking' zones. A two minute limit applies for most vehicles and a five minute limit applies for Mobility Parking Scheme permit holders when picking up and droping off
- Never double park
- Park away from the school and walk to pick up your child
- Stagger arrival times to avoid pick-up/drop-off 'peak time' traffic
