The first change is that we have now replaced our 'level' system with 'minor' and 'major' behaviours. We have also changed the term 'detention' with a more appropriately named Reflection Session. A copy of this will be put in Focus next term. The teachers have also been trained in using the recording and notification system in the school's new internal tracking and monitoring system, Sentral.

The SRC is in the process of deciding our mascot. The class representatives have asked for suggestions and will be choosing from a short list early next term.

You may have noticed some of the assembly awards have had an update. Mrs Reardon refreshed the merit awards for 3-6 and the bronze and silver Brag Book award certificates. When students receive a bronze or silver award, a sticker will be placed in their Brag Book and a certificate will be presented in the assembly. Students can take the certificate home and share their success with their family. The SRC also updated their assembly award.

Next term the whole school will begin to investigate how our expectations to be safe, be respectful, be responsible and be an active learner relate to areas around the school. You will be regularly informed in FOCUS of what the students will be learning.

Ryan is crossing classroom borders

ONE pupil has set his educational pursuits beyond his own learning goals.

Lilli Pilli Public School's Ryan Hollyman, 9, is expanding reach with a project that drew inspiration from personal experience.

It all started during a family holiday to Romania, where Ryan saw potential to help students learn. So he began raising funds, and little by little, he was making a difference. With the money gathered, Ryan donated educational resources including world maps, computer speakers, a wireless router and geometry sets, to the school he visited overseas. A charity established by Ryan's uncle and aunt in Romania used the funds to buy the resources.

"I saw only blackboards, my school has whiteboards. They had a small number of pencils and nothing to play with. My school has lots of stuff," Ryan said. "They were all in one classroom, kindy to year 6. They only had one computer for everyone to share. I felt very proud to see what the fundraising had bought. The most exciting thing is seeing all the smiles."

"The children and teachers were so overwhelmed that someone so young, who lives so far away, cared so much about them and their education," his mother Elyse Corben said.

Lilli Pilli Public School also hosted a fundraiser for the Donald Regan for a Better Life Association. Principal Jane Shepherd is proud of Ryan's hard work. "It's an initiative that really brings out his leadership potential," Mrs Shepherd said. "He has seen firsthand how students in other countries are less fortunate and he wants to lead our school to bring awareness and help others less fortunate than us. We all think that's brilliant." Ryan has also reached out to other schools to spread the word of his project.

School zone safety

Council is committed to promoting safe parking practices around schools, particularly during school zone times, on school days between 8.00am-9:30am and 2:30pm-4.00pm

Illegal parking at these times contributes to traffic congestion and may create unsafe conditions for children and other road users.

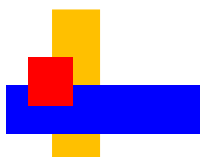
To help deter drivers from choosing to park illegally, Council officers regularly patrol school zones and may issue penalty notices. Officers are also a valuable source of information on how to park safely and avoid receiving a penalty notice.

You can help to promote safety and reduce congestion around schools

- Avoid waiting in 'No Parking' zones. A two minute limit applies for most vehicles and a five minute limit applies for Mobility Parking Scheme permit holders when picking up and dropping off
- Never double park
- Park away from the school and walk to pick up your child
- Stagger arrival times to avoid pick-up/drop-off 'peak time' traffic

Child safety is the responsibility of all road users. Drive safely and park legally.

Election Fundraiser

General

- Sue H will provide a Float of \$150.00. Till to be purchased by Andrea M.

Advertising
