In using Sound Waves we have a sequential and structured program that will accommodate all needs, from those who are beginning readers to those who are using sophisticated language in writing tasks. It is interesting to see how students apply phonemic knowledge to the broader range of tasks such as writing, spelling etc. Very often students can spell a word or recognise that word in isolation but struggle to transfer that knowledge. Sound Waves is giving students 'rules' to help them. Its adding further strings to their repertoire so they are not just relying on sight words or 'sounding out' or visual memory but are able to use their 'rules' and segmenting strategies to help work out a word or a spelling pattern and so transfer their knowledge to a broader range of situations.

Election Fundraiser

- There was a discussion regarding the election fundraiser on the 23/3/19. Consensus that it was a great success.
- Discussion regarding the placement of stalls for future fundraisers in order to improve sales.
- Supplies still remain drinks and sauces.

Easter Raffle

- Easter eggs have been purchases for the raffle prizes.
- There was a discussion regarding purchasing an egg for every child. There are several options available for purchase in mainstream stores.
