TELL THEM FROM ME SURVEYS

STUDENT SURVEY

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures

factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a *Tell Them From Me* student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 26 August and 25 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

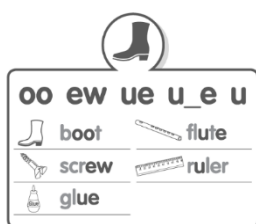

These last 5 weeks of term we have been focusing on being an active learner in our PBL lessons. The students are showing their teachers, both in the classroom and playground how they can be active learners.



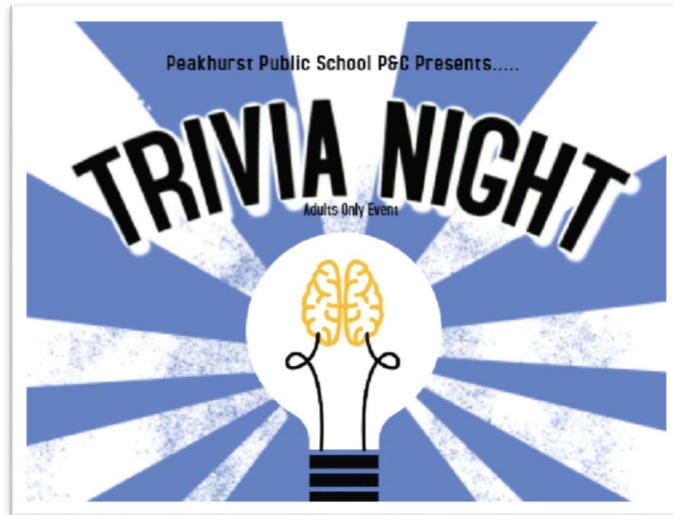
PBL Focus Term 3, Weeks 6-10: Be an Active Learner

What is an active learner? Students will understand that to be an active learner, they must be at school on time and organised for their lessons with all equipment needed. Active learners put effort into their work and listen by using the 5L's. They ask questions, contribute to discussions, participate in all activities and collaborate with others. Active learners think creatively and critically and reflect on their learning whilst thinking about ways they can improve.

We have provided a matrix that can be used by families at home to help promote and reinforce the value of active learning. We hope you find it helpful.

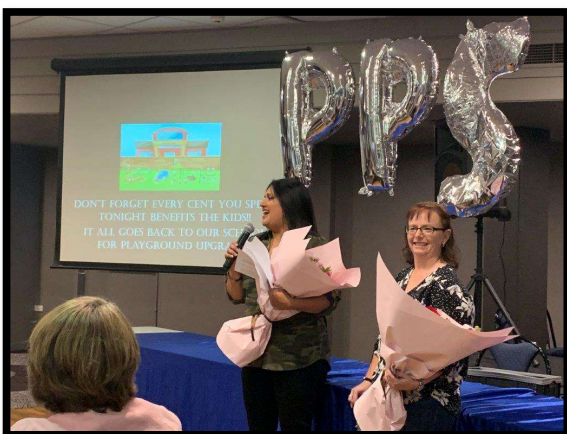

2018 Audit Report

- The Audit Report for 2018 calendar year has been received – report given to Sally Lawson. Unqualified report - all good.

Payments made on behalf of P&C for Reimbursement/Uniform Purchases for Payment

- There have been several expenses paid by members directly (with BBQs, Mother's Day, Easter, Trivia etc) which have required reimbursement.
- It is great that everyone has been so willing to do this. Thank you. Making some certain purchases for fundraising events can be difficult as the P&C banking procedures require 2 signatures.
- To make sure that everyone is reimbursed as quickly as possible, Sue H would like to suggest the following system which has worked well in the past:
- When a purchase has been made (as previously approved at P & C meeting), any original invoices / receipts should be left in the yellow "Treasurer" plastic envelope in the P & C box in the Print Room.
- There will be several blank "Request for Payment" forms in this folder.
- One of these should be completed and signed by the purchaser and left in the folder with the relevant supporting invoice/receipt. This is just to sign off on receipt of goods and to document the person to be reimbursed or the person responsible for requesting payment.

- If payment of an invoice has been made and reimbursement is required, we will need to attach documentation that shows the payment has been made (eg. PAID receipt, bank DD transfer record etc).
- Sue H will check the box weekly, however, feel free to send her a message to let her know when you have dropped something in so she can pick it up straight away – she is happy to call in there anytime when she is up at pickup.
- This procedure will ensure our records are maintained appropriately and in a timely way, and that everyone is reimbursed as soon as possible.
- This procedure should also be used for uniform or other P & C purchases requiring payment directly to a third party supplier.
- Payments can be made as soon as possible after receipt of this paperwork (Invoice/Receipt together with Request for Payment Form) - unless of course something still needs to be authorised by the meeting first.

UNIFORM REPORT:

Presented by Kimberley L

General

- Request for an order was tabled – Sports Polo (size 4 – 10, 12 – 30, size 14Y – 30, size 14S – 10), Wide Brim Hats (S – 40, M – 40, L – 20), Caps (OSFA – 288), Legionnaire Hat (OSFA – 40), Sports shorts (size 4 – 10, size 6 - 20, size 14 – 20, size 16 – 5, size 14S – 20, size 16M – 5), Summer Tunics (size 4 – 20, size 6 - 30, size 8 – 50, size 10 – 30, size 12 – 20, size 14 – 15, size 16 - 5), Long sleeve Summer (size 10 – 1). The total of the order request is \$10,357.35. This request follows the forecasting model which is based on previous year's sales. The P&C approved the order – Kimberley L to attempt, in light of below point to review order request to ensure not ordering any excess.
- The current stock value is \$81,362.68. The ideal limit for stock value should be no more than \$50,000 at peak times (this is just before Kindy Orientation and Winter) and then \$40-\$42,000 in the non-peak times. As the current stock Value is \$81,000+ Kimberley L to try to order closer to likely numbers (to take into account the average of girls to boys in the new year) so to lessen the stock value as soon as possible. Sue H and Kimberley L to meet and discuss how to do this.

Pickles vs Claudine's

- Kimberley L washed the girls sample summer tunic uniform to check durability and confirmed it washes well.
- The P&C approved for the Uniform shop to move from Pickles to Claudine's as the new Uniform supplier as the following conditions were met; Claudine's guaranteed the new uniform price of – \$26.50 plus GST for the 1st order only at this price (plus \$5.50 for the long sleeve option - \$31.50 plus GST) Subsequent orders will be \$28 plus GST (price TBA for long sleeve option). There will be no contract made so if the trial is unsuccessful, we can return to Pickles. Kimberley L to confirm with Claudine's their sizing chart (if there is minimal acceptable size difference then we can fully accept the change to Claudine's). Sue H advised that the pattern should be the same as what it was before when we had purchased uniforms through Claudine's as Claudine's are better at sticking with the standard size and feel much nicer than Pickles.

Long Sleeve Tunic

- A sample of the long sleeve tunic/and order form was made available in the school office and was to be ordered upon request (with a minimum order with Claudine's to be met). As only one Long sleeve order came in despite efforts to increase interest, we didn't meet the minimum order to offer the Long sleeve Tunic as an alternative. However, despite this Claudine's has vowed to honour the one already ordered (this order of 1 is reflected in the PPS Uniform shop request to order above) and as a result, the Uniform shop will not continue with ordering anymore Long sleeve Tunics.

Shopify

- Ray M has volunteered to donate his time to set up Shopify for the Uniform Shop. The P&C approved Ray M to go ahead with this. Kimberley L to follow up and get more information and a trial date as soon as possible.

- The store room was cleaned out and a stock inventory typed up. A huge thank you to Kimberley L for helping out. It is all well organised now and it would be great if it could be kept that way.
- The stock inventory included:
 - many cake boxes which could be used for future use
 - lots of wrapping material and equipment like scissors, boxes of raffle tickets, miscellaneous stationary,
 - old Father's Day gifts (which were organised into station A and station B categories ready for the stall in September)
 - old Mother's Day gifts
 - neon accessories for disco. It is all very well organised now and it would be great if it could be kept that way.

Trivia Night

- Please note again the change of Date. The new date is Saturday the 14th of September, 2019. Saturday night 7pm.
- It will be a \$15 entrance fee (Sue H to look into a possible discount if people form their own group of 8 before the night – for example: \$100 for a table of 8). Sue H to email Andrea M if this is able to be done.
- Venue - Club rivers room hire donated (worth \$500) and 2 x \$50 vouchers (which Andrea M has already picked up). Andrea M has inspected the room and discussed AV requirements etc. The P&C can go to the room at any time on the Saturday to set up.
- Time for Trivia has been booked. Their fees are \$750 plus GST, but they take their fees from money raised on the night through games they play in between trivia rounds, e.g bucket on table, card game, etc. Anything raised over \$750 is profit. The ticket cost is the P&C's as well as any money raised from the raffle prizes.

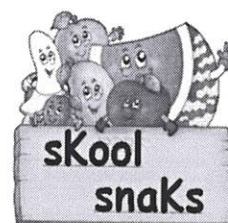

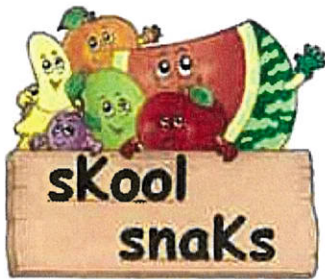
