ICAS MEDAL WINNER

Congratulations to Declan from 1/2 Purple who placed 1^{st} in Australia, New Zealand and the Pacific Region in the University of New South Wales (UNSW) ICAS Competition for spelling.

Students with the top score in each subject in each year level are awarded a medal and a medal winner's certificate at a special presentation ceremony. This year over 980,000 entries were received but only 514 students from Australia and 100 students from New Zealand and the Pacific Region were awarded medals for their outstanding achievement.




I am delighted to announce that the task was finished today with a total of 141 boxes being sent from our school.
